The Czech Republic Quiz Answers

The Czech Republic is located in Central Europe. It borders Poland in the north, Germany in the west, Austria in the south, and Slovakia in the east. The capital city is Prague and other major cities are Brno, Plzeň, Ostrava, or Hradec Králové.

The population of the Czech Republic is about 10 million. The country is divided into three parts: Bohemia, Moravia, and Silesia. There are 14 regions in the Czech Republic (Český Brod is located in Central Bohemian Region). The head of our democratic republic is the president. The legislative power is represented by the Parliament which consists of two chambers, both elected in direct elections: the Chamber of Deputies and the Senate. The head of the executive power is the prime minister.

The country is surrounded by mountain ranges: Krkonoše and Orlické hory in the north, Krušné hory in the west, Šumava in the south, Beskydy and the White Carpathian Mountains in the east. The highest peak is Sněžka (1602 m) in Krkonoše. The major rivers are the Labe, the Vltava, and the Morava.

Charles IV was the king who established the New Town of Prague and founded the University of Prague.

Jan Amos Comenius was the father of modern education who advocated practical education.

Antonín Dvořák was a composer who became famous for his symphony "From the New World", which he wrote in New York.

Karel Čapek was a writer some of whose works reflected his anti-Nazi attitude and who gave the world the word "robot".

Václav Havel was a playwright and a former president who significantly contributed to the end of communism.
